

Develop Neighborhood Communication Tools

- 1. Create excel file of addresses for "snail" mail
 - names & addresses available from property appraiser website
- 2. Add phone numbers to database for calling & texting
 - particularly cell numbers
- 3. Add email addresses to database
 - for sending newsletters
 - Mailchimp is free for databases under 1,000







Develop Neighborhood Communication Tools

- 4. Recruit administrators to manage a social media page
 - Facebook or Nextdoor
- 5. Message boards don't work if not changed regularly

Corridor Chiefs

The cleaner and better maintained a corridor, the lower the crime rates and higher the property values.

Many times we drive on by without even noticing problems, let alone reporting them to the proper agency.

Engaged residents are the key to higher standards and better kept areas.

Duties:

- 1. Maintain a map and list of the Corridor Captains
- 2. Contact Duke Energy when a light is out
- 3. Report 311 problems on the unassigned areas of the corridor
- 4. Pick up snipe signs weekly as needed at the intersections
- 5. Occasionally contact and encourage the Corridor Captains
- 6. Advocate for any infrastructure needs with the county/city

Corridor Captains

The cleaner and better maintained a corridor the lower the crime rates and higher the property values.

Trash and litter are epidemic in Orange County. One volunteer in every subdivision can remedy the situation by picking up and disposing of the trash and snipe signs weekly.

Duties:

- 1. Pick up trash along the assigned section of the roadway weekly
- 2. Report to 311 problems with trash pickup or lawn debris
- 3. Report any larger issues to your Corridor Chief or Commissioner
