Orange County Hurricane Debris Removal Continues



Orange County contractors continue to remove debris caused by Hurricane Ian and Tropical

Storm Nicole. The completion is estimated to occur in mid-December.

Since October 6, 2022, crews have collected more than of 220,000 cubic yards of debris, which would fill 5,500 commercial sized dumpsters, or nearly 15,000 average-sized dump trucks.

Crews continue to work 12-hour days, seven daysa-week to clear county-maintained streets and roads, focusing on subdivisions with critical needs before addressing lesser-affected areas.

As a reminder, all storm debris should be placed in the county's right-of-way in accordance with <u>previous guidance</u> for collection.
